A Behind-the-Scenes Look at

Dr. Seuss's Concept Drawings

introduction

t is nearly impossible to imagine a world without Dr. Seuss's characters. They have been woven into the fabric of popular culture for over three quarters of a century. However, there was a time when they only existed in the far reaches of one man's mind.

With simply a pencil, paper, and his trusted drawing table, these never-before-seen characters passed from the ethereal to the tangible in a series of frenetic, bold, and highly impulsive concept drawings. These were dress rehearsals. They were the first spark of an idea and marked the inception of such iconic characters as The Cat in the Hat, Horton, and Sam-I-am.

The concept drawings included in this historic exhibition offer a rare, behind-the-scenes view into Theodor Seuss Geisel's (aka Dr. Seuss) artistic process. They exemplify the transformative power of ideas and how, in one quick stroke of a pencil, ideas can change the world.

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the concept drawings of dr. seuss

he thrill of going behind-the-scenes to view the artistic process is an opportunity very few people ever get. In the case of Dr. Seuss, we can no longer visit his studio or see his creative process in action. These concept drawings, however, transport us to the moment of creation and allow us to peer over his shoulder as they come to life. We can feel the spark of creation as we follow the curved and dippy lines, and watch as they form the icons that have now become so familiar in our everyday lives.



Ted Geisel (aka Dr. Seuss) drew each page for every Dr. Seuss book published during his lifetime. What many people don't realize is that for each final-line drawing, he would create multiple concept drawings leading up to the final published image.

In the early pencil sketches, we see the frenetic energy of someone trying to work out his ideas as quickly as possible, almost as if he is going to lose the inkling if he doesn't work fast enough. The remarkable outcome of such impulsive

In the more refined pen and ink concept drawings, we see the nuanced changes that push the story forward. Ted's tireless reworking of these drawings, in many cases over the course of an entire year, was an effort to get his characters and compositions to be more powerful, more insightful, and closer to the lessons he endeavored to convey. He would draw each page multiple times, beginning with the rough pencil sketches and evolving to the final pen and ink drawings. If unsatisfied, he would begin again.

Each new series of drawings would be tacked up on the corkboard walls of his studio. Simultaneously, he would rewrite text passages, cut them out and paste them onto the new drawings until he was surrounded by the developing story. He would repeat this process multiple times in his quest to perfect the narrative. The magic of Dr. Seuss was that, while he never felt he achieved perfection, he always left us feeling as if he did.

The works in this exhibition are a shining example that perfection is illusive, that perseverance in achieving one's goals is a worthy pursuit, and that passion for one's craft is more important than achieving the perfect outcome.




the pencil sketches


ed's early pencil sketches capture the creative impulse of the artist just as his ideas are tumbling from his mind to the drawing page for the first time. The spirit of the final images are intact, the details have been roughed-in, character personalities have taken shape and the path toward a final-line drawing has been mapped out. Ted was less worried about the quality of the line at this stage and seemed more focused on the energy and personality of the scene.

Some of the world's most iconic characters and memorable compositions were born during this stage, with the spark of creation changing the face of children's literature forever.








the pen & ink drawings

olor was a key ingredient in making Dr. Seuss's stories so engaging to children. Ted believed that the right color could catch a child's eye and move them through the story, even if they couldn't read. He had long since memorized the color charts and knew exactly which hues he wanted for each element of every page.

These pen and ink drawings marked the final stage in Ted's creative process and were the moment when color took center stage. Executed after the pencil sketches, these works contain his final color decisions and meticulously detailed notes written to his publisher.

Ted's explosive color played out across these images in bold, energetic strokes of oil pastel and crayon. His choices ignited these drawings, bringing to life the pen and ink lines and pushing them to their final stage of development.











hese historic works highlight the nuanced changes that would occur throughout the development of a single page. They pair together some of Ted's earliest pencil sketches with his final pen and ink drawings of the same scene. The gap between these works could span as long as a year, whereby Ted would continue to refine and redraw the scene.



This analog editing process would unfold across the corkboard walls that surrounded his studio. As the sketches took shape, he would tack them onto the walls in an effort to fully immerse himself in the developing story. Ted could sense the pace of the narrative, the emotions of the characters, and adjust accordingly with new and more refined drawings that would slowly push the works to their final stage.

If one looks closely, the subtle differences begin to reveal themselves: Sneetches shaking hands in pencil at the start of the drawing process are found holding hands in the final-line drawing, or A Thneed No One Needs is seen transforming from a garment one could actually wear to its final iteration as an item with no perceptible use.

These side-by-side artworks allow us to see the genius of Ted's artistic talent and showcase his tireless desire to improve the narrative throughout the development process.





about the art of dr. seuss collection



heodor Seuss Geisel, a.k.a. Dr. Seuss, began his career as a little-known editorial cartoonist in the 1920s. His intriguing perspective and fresh concepts ignited his career, and his work evolved quickly to deft illustrations, modeled sculpture, and sophisticated oil paintings of elaborate imagination. His artistic vision emerged as the golden thread that linked every facet of his varied career, and his artwork became the platform from which he delivered numerous

children's books, hundreds of advertisements, and countless editorials filled with wonderfully inventive animals, characters, and humor.

Geisel single-handedly forged a new genre of art that falls somewhere between the surrealist movement of the early 20th century and the inspired nonsense of a child's classroom doodles. The Art of Dr. Seuss Collection project offers a rare glimpse into the artistic life of this celebrated American icon and chronicles almost seven decades of work that in every respect is uniquely, stylistically, and endearingly Seussian.
